

To be eligible for a baccalaureate degree in eight semesters from the University of Arkansas at Monticello, a student must file a Program of Study approved by his/her advisor and the academic department chair upon entering the University. The Program of Study must contain a minimum 120 semester hours of unduplicated credit at the 1000-level or above, 40 of which must be upper-level credit hours. Students planning to teach should review the certification requirements provided by the School of Education. Specific degree requirements are listed at the end of the Program of Study. The Program of Study is for informational purposes only; it is the responsibility of the student to fulfill all requirements for graduation at the University of Arkansas at Monticello. The Program of Study is subject to change as academic program changes are needed to comply with the Arkansas Department of Higher Education regulations.

NOTE: Some courses require pre-requisite and/or co-requisite classes. UAM reserves the right to substitute courses. Contact the department chair for specific information. Some courses may only be offered during specific semesters. Students who score below the required minimum level on placement exams will be required to take additional credit hours as part of this University’s developmental education program.
