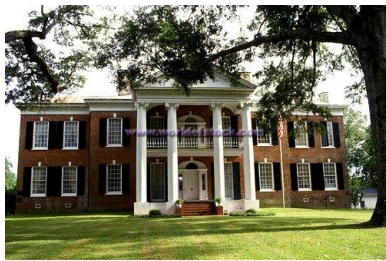


Regional Travel/Study Programs:

The Horizons Program has a regional component, whereby students are given the opportunity to take short day-trips to historical sites near their hometown. You will be surprised at the places that are so close, yet you have never been!

In the past few years, students have had the opportunity to visit the Clinton Presidential Library in Little Rock, as well as four ante bellum townhouses in Natchez, Mississippi.

As explained by Dr. Bill Shea: *"We visited Natchez during the annual Spring Pilgrimage and explored historic sites in and around the city, including four fascinating antebellum town houses; the home and business of William Johnson, the Barber of Natchez, probably the most famous free black man in the Old South; and the spectacular ruins of Windsor, the grandest plantation home ever built in Mississippi."*



Other students have had the opportunity to travel to places closer to home, but just as important to see ... such as the Clinton Library in Little Rock.



Future trips may include such places or events as Memphis, Tennessee, the Helena Blues Festival, New Orleans, area museums, or academic conferences. It just depends on the opportunities that become available.

Currently under discussion is a trip to various historical sites in the south related to the Civil Rights Movement during the 1960s. If this is of interest to you, please contact us.
