

The survey is administered to novice teachers in the fall of each year and is aligned to the Charlotte Danielson domains and the Arkansas Teacher Excellence Support System domains and the InTASC standards. The data indicate that based on the survey candidates feel that the training they received from the University of Arkansas at Monticello School of Education was effective. Domain 1f has the lowest average score for all the components. Domain 1f is based on designing student assessments that are congruence with instructional outcomes, criteria and standards, design of formative assessments, and use for planning. This is also the lowest area on the employer survey. The School of Education changed the curriculum in the fall of 2020 to include an advanced assessment course to provide candidates with a stronger background in assessment.
