EAST DIVISION

North Alabama forward Amber Rutherford (Sr., 5-11, Hatton, Ala.) is the winner of the East Division Player of the Week award for the second time this season. Rutherford had a monster final game of the year, leading North Alabama as they defeated East Division champion West Georgia. The senior poured in 22 points, shooting an impressive 8-of-11 from the field (72.7 pct). She also had 10 rebounds, adding another double-double performance to her career total. She added a steal, and went a perfect 6-for-6 from the free throw line.

WEST DIVISION

Ouachita Baptist guard Domino Miller (Fr., 5-6, Mountain Home, Ark.) earns the West Division Player of the Week Award. Miller set a career-high in points scored with 20 against rival Henderson State, pushing OBU to a 94-75 win. The freshman then went on to break that mark one game later, with 21 points in a 72-66 win over Harding that nailed down OBU as the fourth seed in the West Division. Miller shot 60 percent from beyond the arc this week, and made 15 out of 17 at the free throw line.

GSC WOMEN'S TOURNAMENT PREVIEW

GSC TOURNAMENT PREVIEW MARCH 4-MARCH 8 DESOTO CIVIC CENTER SOUTHAVEN, MISS.

FIRST ROUND - WEDNESDAY, MARCH 4

Game I-E5 Montevallo (8-19, 4-8) v. **W4 Ouachita Baptist** (20-7, 9-5) - 12:30 p.m.

Montevallo and Ouachita Baptist kick off Championship week, as the two squads will take the court against each other for the rubber match in the DeSoto Civic Center. These teams have already played twice, splitting the home and home series during the season.

This will be the Falcons fourth trip to the GSC Tournament, and their second trip to Southaven. UM made the conference tourney in 2006-07, but fell in the opening round. Montevallo does have one win in four attempts, and will look to better that this time around. The Falcons' defense will take center stage if they are to pick up the win, as UM has held teams to under 66 points per game this season, a top six mark in the GSC. Their field goal defense is even better, limiting opposing teams to under 38 percent shooting from the floor (3rd-GSC). First year head coach Brittney Ezell's squad finished the year on a down note, losing two games to fall to the fifth seed.

Ouachita Baptist enters the tournament as one of the hotter teams, having won its last three to capture the West Division's fourth seed. OBU is making its third trip to the postseason event, and is still looking for their first victory. The Tigers are 20-7 on the year, and currently ranked 10th in the South Region. Head coach Garry Crowder's team finished up conference play at 9-5, while defeating this Montevallo bunch 82-68 in their last encounter. OBU can score, averaging 78.3 points per game, second in the conference. They have pummeled teams during the year, with an average margin of defeat of just over 10 points per game.

KEY PLAYERS: Montevallo has the only All-GSC player in this matchup, as forward Alicia Lewis was named a first team member by the league's coaches. Lewis averaged 13 points per game, and made 59 three point shots on the year. OBU is lead by freshman sensation A'Laeshia Adams, who poured in over 13 points per game in her rookie campaign. She started in only half of the Tigers' games, but made a solid contribution for this year's team.

GAME II-W5 Harding (19-9, 5-9) v. **E4 West Alabama** (11-16, 5-7) - 5:30 p.m.

Harding and West Alabama open up the night session of the first day, taking the court in the 5:30 game that promises to be an exciting matchup.

West Alabama comes into this contest looking for some revenge, as they were handled by the Lady Bisons 99-54 in an earlier matchup this year. UWA finished strong, picking up two league wins in their final games to move up to the fourth slot in the East Division. Head coach Amanda Marks team finished the year at 11-16 and 5-7 in conference action. Active hands on the defensive end can account for some of that success, with the Tigers picking up nine steals every time they hit the court. They can also get hot from beyond the arc, hitting more than four treys per game.

Harding has had a roller-coaster of a season, starting of the year 12-0 before finishing up the campaign at 19-9. The Lady Bisons were ranked in the national polls at one point this year, but midyear struggles find themselves as the fifth seed in the West Division. Offensively, head coach Tim Kirby's squad is lethal, shooting the best field goal percentage in all of the GSC (46.4 %). Harding averages 78 points per game, and has put up 100 points in two games this year. They also convert from the free throw line, nailing 71 percent of their attempts, another top three mark in the conference.

KEY PLAYERS: West Alabama had one lone representative on the All-GSC team, with forward Valerie Harris making the second team. The senior forward averaged 15 points per game and 7.4 rebounds. She was also a Player of the Week winner and shot 52 percent from the field. Harding has two all-conference players, including first teamer Stacey Owens. Owens, a player of the week recipient in her own right, is sixth in the league in scoring at 16.4 a contest. Ashley Anderson is also dangerous, nailing on 52 percent of her shots from the floor.

QUARTER-FINALS - THURSDAY, MARCH 6

GAME IV-E2 Valdosta State (20-7, 9-3) v. W3 Arkansas Tech (19-8, 9-5) - 2:45 p.m.

Two familiar foes square off in one of our quarterfinal matchups, with Valdosta State taking on Arkansas Tech at 2:45 on Saturday. These two squads locked horns in last year's semifinals, with ATU picking up a hard fought 62-51 win over VSU.

Valdosta State is making its 17th trip to the GSC Dance, the highest mark other than Delta State in the entire league. The Lady Blazers have essentially been a .500 team in this venue, winning 15 games in their history. They have made it to the semifinals 13 times, the championship game six occasions, and hoisted the title twice in 1983 and 1984. This year's edition had another solid year, going 20-7 overall and 9-3 in the East Division. VSU head coach Kiley Hill has won 66 percent of his games at Valdosta, an impressive mark. The Lady Blazers have won five straight coming into Southaven, the second largest win streak entering this tournament.

Arkansas Tech makes its ninth appearance in the GSC Tournament in only its 14th year in the Gulf South Conference. Tech has been formidable in the GSC Tournament, going 17-6 over that span while advancing to at least the semifinals every trip they've made to the postseason. The Golden Suns have six finals appearances along with two championships in 1998 and 2003. They have made the last two consecutive championship games, falling in both contests to eventual champion Delta State. Head coach Dave Wilbers is 46-14 at the helm of the ATU program, an outstanding mark that has continued the success of past coaches.

KEY PLAYERS: Valdosta State has had great defensive success, but on the offensive end they look to their in and out combo of Leschelle Matthews and Brittany Hudson. Hudson and Matthews combine for nearly 20 points per game, 10 rebounds and five assists. Arkansas Tech rides the shoulders of the GSC West Division Player of the Year Amanda Grappe. Grappe has had an outstanding career for ATU, and this year cemented her legacy. She averaged 19 points per game (2nd-GSC), eight rebounds (3rd-GSC) and was named player of the week three times.

GAME V-W2 Arkansas-Monticello (18-7, 10-4) v. E3 North Alabama (15-12, 8-4) - 5:30 p.m.

The other two versus three contest should be a great game, with Arkansas-Monticello squaring off against North Alabama. Both teams enter this matchup on winning streaks, after having solid records in conference play.

Arkansas-Monticello opened some eyes at last year's tournament, making it from the play in game all the way to the semifinals. Some of that squad returned this year, and put up an impressive 10-4 in the West Division. UAM is 18-7 overall, and ranked sixth in the South Region. This is UAM's fifth trip to the conference tournament, and last year's semifinal appearance is one of two in the school's history. Head coach Chris Ratcliff has the most explosive offense in the league, averaging a shade under 79 points per game. They are also strong on the boards, grabbing 42 rebounds a contest, second in the GSC. Not to shabby defensively, they are tops in the league in steals per game (12.96)

North Alabama improved on their seeding from a year ago, going from the play-in day to the third seed in the East Division. UNA is 15-12 on the year, put 8-4 in conference play. The Lions make their 12th appearance at the conference event, looking to improve their performance from the past. UNA has won a title, in 1985, but holds a 5-11 mark overall. UNA head coach Terry Fowler has focused on fundamentals, evident by an 81 percent free throw percentage as a team, the best mark in the GSC. North Alabama also shares the ball well, dishing out 15.30 assists per game, a top three mark in the conference.

KEY PLAYERS: Arkansas-Monticello features two first team All-GSC players in Monica Perkins-Miller and Andrea Dubose. That two-man game has accounted for 27 points and 15 rebounds per game. Dubose also leads the conference in steals, swiping four every time she steps on the court. North Alabama has a solid lineup of their own, lead by former GSC Player of the Year Amber Rutherford and current Freshman of the Year Dana Jackson. Rutherford was named player of the week this year, while adding 17 points and seven rebounds. Jackson is a lethal shooter, connecting on 45 percent of her three point shots.
