Step 1: Complete the graduate admissions application for UAM

Step 2: Submit one official transcript from each college attended to UAM Admission

Step 3: Complete the M.A.T. Program Application

Step 4: Submit two official transcripts from each college attended to the School of Education

Step 5: Submit three letters of recommendation to the School of Education

Once all admission documents are reviewed candidates will get a letter saying they are eligible to take courses.

Candidates will be required to complete ProEthica and all Professional Development required for provisional license the first semester they are in the program.

Praxis Content Areas Assessment must be passed to be eligible for a provisional license. Once scores are reviewed candidates will receive a letter of hire they can present to a district stating they are eligible for hire under a provisional license.

A 3.0 GPA is required throughout the program.

Candidates must teach for two semesters be eligible for graduation.

Candidate must submit required scores on the ACT or Praxis Core exam to be eligible for graduation. ACT Require Scores 20 Math, 20 Reading, 6 Writing/Praxis Core Required Scores 162 Math, 168 Reading, 165 Writing

Candidate must submit passing scores on the Principles of Learning and Teaching exam to be eligible for graduation

Candidates seeking a K-6 license are required to pass the Foundation of Teaching Reading exam and to be eligible for graduation.
