

UAM Concurrent Enrollment Parent Resources

We're excited that you and your child are interested in earning college credit while still in high school. UAM's Concurrent Enrollment Program provides a wide range of options—from technical courses to general education classes—available at all three UAM campuses (Monticello, Crossett, and McGehee). Students in the program also receive full access to UAM resources. Because concurrent enrollment involves true college-level work, students must be prepared to manage their time well, meet firm deadlines, stay organized, and handle the academic rigor with maturity and commitment.

Benefits of Concurrent Enrollment

- Students can earn high school and college credit at the same time.
- Potential to earn certificates of proficiency, technical certificates, and associate degrees and reduce time towards a bachelor's degree.
- Provides early experience in college level coursework.
- Cost savings for students and families.

FERPA

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. If you need access to your student's information, your student must complete the Friends and Family task in Workday. This allows them to give you third party-party- access to view class schedules, grades, financial account details, and to make payments

Student Handbook

Concurrent high school students must follow all UAM policies and procedures. They are responsible for reviewing both the UAM Concurrent Student Handbook and the UAM Student Handbook.

Transferability

The [Arkansas Department of Higher Education's Course Transfer System](#) (A.C.T.S. helps students, families, and schools see how general education courses transfer between Arkansas public colleges and universities. A.C.T.S. covers general education courses, but some majors have specific requirements. Always check with the college where you plan to graduate to confirm what you need. Most colleges and universities require a grade of C or higher for a course to transfer.

UAM Schedule

High school and university calendars often differ; students must follow the UAM academic calendar. If the high school is closed, students are still expected to attend their UAM classes and may need to arrange transportation. Check with your high school for any specific guidance.
