stop the spread

Wear a Mask

in any indoor spaces on campus any time you are unable to maintain distance from others. The Board of Trustees voted to require masks on campus August 11, 2021 pursuant to current CDC COVID-19 prevention guidance.



Wash Hands

often, for at least 20 seconds, using soap and water. If you can't wash using soap and water, use a hand sanitizer that is at least 60% alcohol. Wash hands and sanitize high-touch surfaces frequently.



Socially Distance

from those not in your household whenever possible, even if you are wearing masks. Leaving space makes the spread of the virus and its variants less likely.



Get Tested*

if you have COVID-19 symptoms or if you may have been exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, get tested and follow the current CDC recommendations if you are positive. CDC guidance on self-isolating may vary depending upon whether or not you have received a vaccine.



Get Vaccinated*

anyone age 12 and older can receive COVID-19 vaccinations locally. UAM students, faculty and staff can get vaccines on campus. Discuss questions about vaccinations with your primary health care provider.



*Mainline Health Systems provides free COVID-19 testing (including rapid tests) and walk-in COVID-19 vaccination appointments on the Monticello campus. Students and employees can visit the Maxwell Hall location for these free resources. UAM Mainline site hours are Monday - Friday 7 a.m. - 11:30 a.m. and 12 - 3:30 p.m. Call ahead when able : 870-224-0657.
